

Prior to having a unit dedicated to traffic control and investigation, uniformed police officers used arm signals to control traffic at intersections.

In July of 1915, fifteen semaphores were placed downtown by Chief Herbert to assist officers in directing traffic. The Traffic Division was formed on April 23, 1922 and the unit transformed dynamically over the years. By 1927, 142 intersections were controlled by traffic lights. In April of 1933, Patrolmen Bill Lucas and George Kerwin were assigned to the first police squad car to be used exclusively in the prevention and investigation of traffic accidents.

The Toledo Police Division began to acquire portable radios in late April of 1966. The first portables were large in size and at the time considered lightweight at five pounds! The leather case had a loop for the gun belt but they also needed a shoulder strap, especially for extended foot patrol. The radio had to be removed from the case and the antenna, (which extended to approximately 2 feet) had to be extended for the transmissions to be heard.

Policewoman Margaret Slater, was appointed to the division on April 16, 1922 and became sergeant of the Women's Bureau on April 1, 1928, which she would head for the next 29 years. During her career, she feigned employment in dives, was slugged and strangled and stuffed in a wastebasket, and posed as a patient seeking an abortion. She was mobbed by teenagers while attempting to send them home from a beer hall, was used as a decoy for rapists and sex degenerates. Other instances show she allowed a kidnapper to lead her along until she captured him (an action for which she was criticized for recklessness by her superiors), and talked to a suspected murderer for six blocks, all while walking him into police headquarters before he knew she was a policewoman. Margaret was an expert marksman who slept with a pearl handled .32 pistol under her pillow.

The police boat "Kwianna" was used in the 1920s to enforce the liquor prohibition laws of the bootlegger era. The boat was destroyed by fire in 1930 and no attempt was made to replace it. In 1953, the Harbor Patrol borrowed a boat from the sewage treatment division of the city. This boat was a Lyman Islander and was operated by Donald Brandle, an employee from the sewer treatment division. It was manned by Officer Al Carper, the first officer assigned to the harbor patrol. In 1955, the city obtained a 1930 26' Chris Craft from the Coast Guard and the Harbor Patrol went into full-time operation during the navigational season.

The Toledo Police Division Pistol Range at Bay View Park (near Summit and Manhattan streets) was dedicated in 1924. The range was built by members of the police department and was reported to be one of the best in the country, if not the world. It was estimated at that time to have been worth \$100,000. The total construction cost however, was \$5.60. Most of the materials were donated and the labor was performed by the officers themselves.

In September of 1907 the department purchased two onecylinder motorcycles from the Consolidated Manufacturing Company, a Toledo firm that made Yale motorcycles and bicycles. Until this point, the department operated with foot patrolmen and horse-drawn police wagons, which were slow in reaching the scene of a crime. In March of 1908, six men were equipped with Yale motorcycles.

The squad was instrumental in breaking up many of the gangs who prowled through neighborhoods, treating the relatively slow foot patrolmen and horse drawn wagons with contempt.

A clerk inputs information into Toledo's new traffic violation record system. Toledo was the first city in the United States to use the system to tabulate both parking and moving vehicle violations.

In 1952, the Toledo Journal wrote an article titled, "Watch that Ticket. Machines Will Keep Books on Violators." They were raving about the new traffic violation record system through which a permanent and unchangeable record would be created of a driver's mistakes, penalties and court actions. This machine was described as "nearhuman" in its capabilities. The record was created here and went through another machine that alphabetized the cards, nicknamed "Magic Fingers."

The Toledo Police alarm system was built during 1907-1908. By 1916, there were 136 Gamewell Police Alarm boxes in service. Eventually the police alarm system would have 1,056 miles of wires, almost all underground, serving 248 alarm boxes and 51 auxiliary telephone circuits. There were no radios at this time, so crews on scout cars had to call the dispatcher from the street call boxes every 15 minutes and they would get all accumulated complaints by phone.

In 1930, stories in the Toledo News Bee pointing out the results obtained by other cities using radio-equipped police cars prompted the department to investigate purchasing a modern radio system. It was discovered that a system could be purchased for about \$4,000. City council approved the purchase of 10 receiving units to be installed in police scout cars and on November 8, 1930, installation of a low-powered radio broadcast system began in the new Police and Fire Alarm Building. Police communications began broadcasting on station WRDQ.

The Commission on Publicity and Efficiency was established in November of 1914. The purpose of the commission was to investigate city departments for their efficiency in rendering public service, publish reports in the Toledo City Journal and make recommendations to improve civic conditions.

The Toledo Publicity and Efficiency Commission took hundreds of photographs of the municipal government at work, from 1946 to the early 1960s. The entire photo collection is available for viewing at the Toledo Police Museum, 2201 Kenwood Blvd, Toledo.

#### 2019 Toledo Police Day-Off Schedule
